### **STATED CODE OF ETHICS FOR RESEARCH- THROUGH THE PRESENCE OF ETHICS COMMITTEE**

The research council of Queen Mary's College (A), expects its members to adhere to the highest ethical and safety standards. The principles of Code of Conduct of research fraternity were prepared by the Council Committee on Professional ethics and approved and adopted by the Council (March 16, 1994), for the guidance of members in various professional dealings. The Professional's Code of Conduct (PCC) was updated to better reflect the changing times and current trends of research in 2007 and subsequently updated in 2012, 2016 and 2019. The current version of the PCC was approved by the Council on 28.8.2019. The Council Committee on Professional Code of Conduct explicitly lists among its objectives:

- The work and learning research through high standards of professional ethics.
- The research fraternity should ensure the highest standards of scientific integrity, which includes sharing ideas and information, keeping accurate and complete records and giving due credit to the contributions of others.
- The PCC are incompatible to scientific misconduct such as undisclosed conflicts of interest, fabrication, falsification, and plagiarism.
- Research professionals should treat others with respect and will not engage in discrimination, harassment, bullying, dishonesty, fraud, misrepresentation, coercive manipulation, censorship, or other misconduct..
- Researchers should be mindful to avoid all bias based on race, gender, age, religion, ethnicity, nationality, sexual orientation, gender expression, gender identity, presence of disabilities, educational background, or other personal attributes.
- Honestly report data, results, methods and procedures. Do not fabricate, falsify, or misrepresent data. Do not deceive colleagues, research sponsors, or the public.
- Avoid careless errors and negligence; carefully and critically examine your own work and the work of your peers.
- Share data, results, ideas, tools, resources. Be open to criticism and new ideas.
- Honor patents, copyrights, and other forms of intellectual property. Never plagiarize.
- Respect your colleagues and treat them fairly.
- Strive to promote social good and prevent or mitigate social harms through research, public education, and advocacy.
- Show proper respect and care for animals when using them in research
